RESOLUTION # 01-09-19-1

Purpose: To add the following language to the Village of Gratiot Municipal Code: Chapter 17, Section 08, pertaining to outdoor wood burners. Effective date of compliance will be 07/01/2019

(6)	The Existing outdoor wood-fired furnace shall not be used to but	urn any of the prohibited materials listed below
	c	arm any or the promoted materials instea below

- (a) Materials that may not be burned. Unless a specific written approval has been obtained from the Department of Natural Resources, the following materials may not be burned in an open fire, incinerator, burn barrel, furnace, stove or any other indoor or outdoor incineration or heating device.
- (b) Rubbish or garbage including but not limited to food wastes, food wraps, packaging, animal carcasses, paint or painted materials, furniture, composite shingles, construction or demolition debris or other household or business wastes.
- (c) Waste oil or other oily wastes except used oil burned in a heating device for energy recovery subject to the restrictions in Chapter NR 590, Wisconsin Administrative Code.
- (d) Asphalt and products containing asphalt.
- (e) Treated or painted wood including but not limited to plywood, composite wood products or other wood products that are painted, varnished or treated with preservatives.
- (f) Any plastic material including but not limited to nylon, PVC, ABS, polystyrene or urethane foam, and synthetic fabrics, plastic films and plastic containers.
- (g) Rubber including tires and synthetic rubber-like products.
- (h) Newspaper, corrugated cardboard, container board, office paper and other materials that must be recycled in accordance with the recycling ordinance except as provided

(7) Stack height

(a) The outdoor wood-fired furnace shall have a chimney that extends at least 15 feet above the ground surface. If there are any residences within 500 feet, the chimney shall also extend at least as high above the ground surface as the height of the roofs of all such residences. The Fire Chief may approve a lesser height on a case-by-case basis if necessary to comply with manufacturer's recommendations and if the smoke from the lower chimney height does not create a nuisance for neighbors.

(b) The owner of the outdoor wood-fired furnace shall obtain an annual permit from the Fire Chief in

accordance of this ordinance if the fur	nace is located within 1000 feet of another resi	dence.
